Scotland's Epidemic

SAMH campaign on young people's mental health





Half of all adults who are mentally ill experienced the onset of their mental health problems by the age of 14. Prevention is the key. We need to help young people before they become unwell.





What we found

- One call every 30 mins to ChildLine
- 3 in 10 young people in the classroom
- 16,000 young people rejected from CAMHS
- Suicide is still one of the biggest killers of young men in Scotland today
- 80% of teenage girls report high school pressure
- 1,000 cases of school children self harming in Scotland
- 1 in 5 young people report they don't know where to go
- Young people in Scotland who feel 'very 'happy' reduces steeply with age





There are more than 900,000 children and young people living Scotland. Our mission is to change things for these young people and for generations to come.











Campaign aims

- To raise awareness of the issue
- To inform and influence SG
- To effect positive change
- · To build a movement





Aaron's story















- By 2018, create a programme to train all school staff in mental health
- By 2020, provide counselling services across Scotland's secondary schools
- By 2020, let children and young people stay in specialist services till age 25
